FCSO Commander Barile to Attend Prestigious FBI National Academy

BUNNELL, Fla. — Commander Joe Barile has been invited to attend the 292nd session of the FBI National Academy in Quantico, Virginia. Commander Barile will be the third active Flagler County Sheriff's Office member to attend this prestigious academy, joining Sheriff Rick Staly (177th Session) and Chief Jon Welker (286th Session).

The FBI National Academy is a professional course of study for United States and international law enforcement managers that have been nominated by their agency heads because of demonstrated leadership qualities and selected by the FBI to attend.

The 10-week program serves to improve the administration of justice in law enforcement agencies in the United States and abroad to raise law enforcement standards, knowledge, and cooperation worldwide. The program's coursework includes intelligence theory, terrorism and terrorist mindsets, management science, law, behavioral science, law enforcement communication, and forensic science. The FBI covers all costs associated with attending the FBI National Academy.

According to the FBI National Academy Associates Inc., graduates of this program make up the highest 1% of all senior law enforcement officers in the world.

"This is a great honor for both Commander Barile and the Flagler County Sheriff's Office," said Sheriff Staly. "As a graduate of the 177th Session, I know firsthand just how valuable and worthwhile this training experience is. Only the best of the best receive the opportunity to attend the FBI National






Academy, and the fact that our Agency will have three active members who have attended is something to be proud of as we work to ensure the highest level of service for our community."

Commander Barile began his law enforcement career in 2007 as a Deputy Sheriff. He currently oversees FCSO's Homeland Security and Investigations Section.
